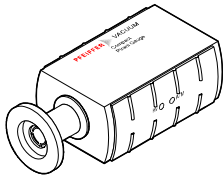

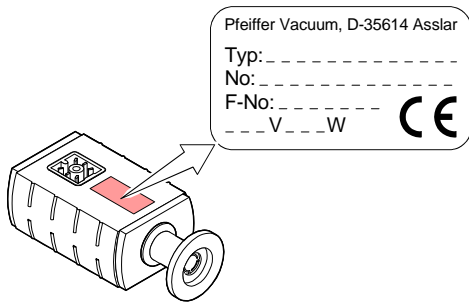

Intended Use

The Compact Pirani Gauge TPR 265 has been designed for vacuum measurement of gases in the pressure range of 5×10^{-4} ... 1000 mbar.

The gauge can be operated in connection with a Pfeiffer Vacuum controller for Compact Gauges or with another evaluation unit.

Functional Principle

Over the whole measurement range, the measurement signal is output as a logarithm of the pressure.

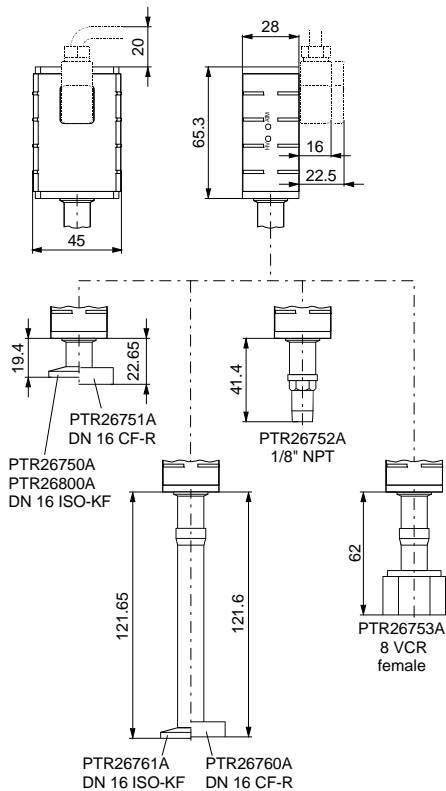

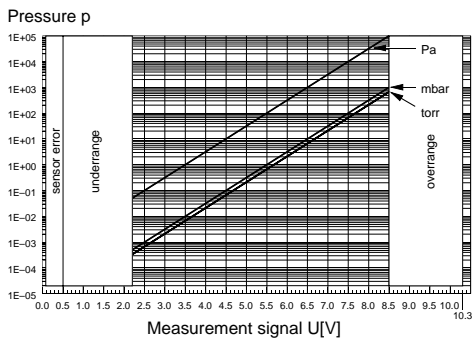

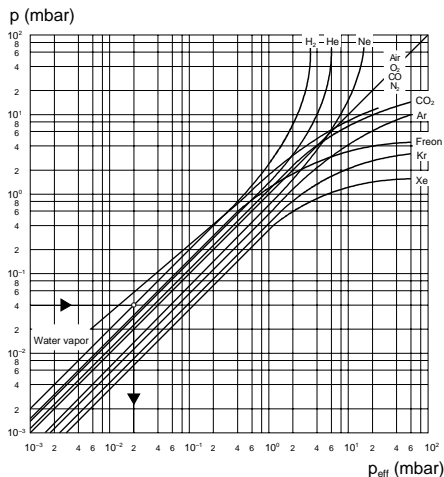

Installation

Vacuum Connection

STOP DANGER

Caution: overpressure in the vacuum system >1 bar

Injury caused by released parts and harm caused by escaping process gases can result if clamps are opened while the vacuum system is pressurized.

Do not open any clamps while the vacuum system is pressurized. Use the type clamps which are suited to overpressure.

STOP DANGER

Caution: overpressure in the vacuum system >2.5 bar

KF connections with elastomer seals (e.g. O-rings) cannot withstand such pressures. Process media can thus leak and possibly damage your health.

Use O-rings provided with an outer centering ring.

STOP DANGER

Caution: protective ground

The gauge must be electrically connected to the grounded vacuum chamber. This connection must conform to the requirements of a protective connection according to EN 61010:

- CF-, NPT- and 8 VCR connections fulfill this requirement.
- For gauges with a KF connection, use a conductive metallic clamping ring

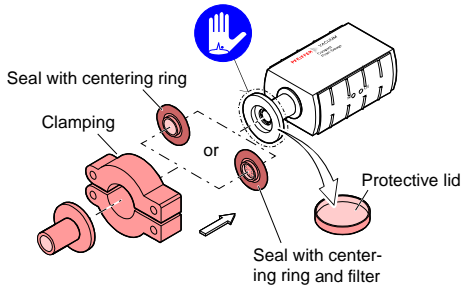
The gauge may be mounted in any orientation. To keep condensates and particles from getting into the measuring chamber preferably choose a horizontal to upright position and possibly use a seal with a centering ring and filter. If adjustment should be possible after the gauge has been installed, be sure to install it so that potentiometers <HV> and <ATM> can be accessed with a screwdriver (→ "Adjusting the Gauge").



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Remove the protective lid and install the product to the vacuum system.

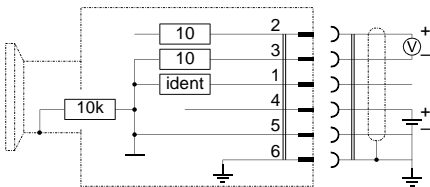
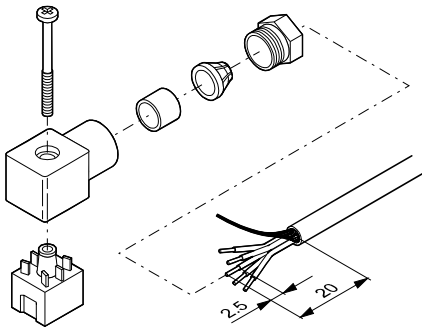

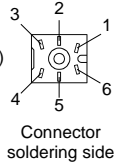
Electrical Connection

Make sure the vacuum connection is properly made (→ "Vacuum Connection").

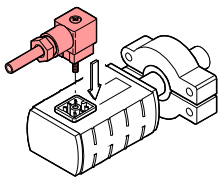
1 If no sensor cable is available, make one according to the following diagram.



Electrical connection
 Pin 1 identification
 Pin 2 signal output (measuring signal)
 Pin 3 signal common
 Pin 4 supply (+14 ... +30 VDC)
 Pin 5 supply common
 Pin 6 screening



2 Connect the sensor cable to the gauge and secure the cable socket with the lock screw.



3 Connect the sensor cable to the controller.

Operation

When the supply voltage is applied, the measurement signal is available between pins 2 and 3 (relationship between measurement signal and pressure → "Technical Data"). Allow a stabilization period of at least 2 minutes. It is advisable to operate the gauge continuously, irrespective of the pressure.

Gas type Dependence

The measurement value is gas dependent. The pressure reading applies to dry air, O₂, CO and N₂. For other gases, it has to be corrected (→ "Technical Data").

If the gauge is operated with an Pfeiffer Vacuum controller for Compact Gauges, a calibration factor for correction of the actual reading can be applied (→ of the corresponding controller).

Adjusting the Gauge

The gauge is factory calibrated. Due to long time operation or contamination, a zero drift could occur. Periodically check the zero and adjust it if necessary.

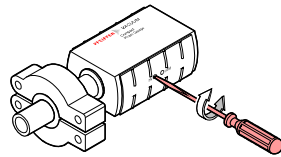
The zero must be adjusted at the ambient temperature at which the gauge is normally operated.

1 If you are using a seal with centering ring and filter, check that they are clean or replace them if necessary (→ "Deinstallation").

2 Activate the gauge.

3 Evacuate it to $p \ll 10^{-4}$ mbar and wait at least 2 minutes.

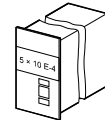


Adjust the <HV> potentiometer by means of a 1.5 mm screwdriver ...

... to 1.55 V

or

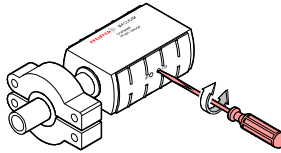
... to 5×10^{-4} mbar



... and then turn it counterclockwise $\approx 1/4$ turn.

5 Vent the gauge with air to atmospheric pressure, and wait at least 2 minutes.

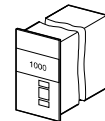


Adjust the <ATM> potentiometer by means of a 1.5 mm screwdriver ...

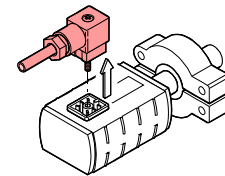

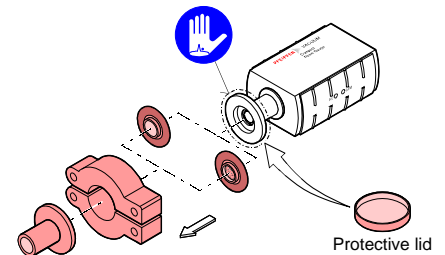
1 Vent the vacuum system.

3 Loosen the lock screw and unplug the sensor cable.



4 Remove the gauge from the vacuum system.



Maintenance, Repair

In case of severe contamination or a malfunction, the sensor can be replaced.


